REMEMBER - LOCK UP, LIGHT UP

- Leave some lights on if it will be dark before you get home or use light timers.
- If you can, leave a radio on to create the impression that someone's home.
- Fit intruder alarms, door chains and door locks.
- Lock garages, sheds and all windows.
- Don't leave keys or valuables where they can be seen from doors or windows.
- Never hide spare keys outside, such as under a flowerpot. It's the first place burglars look.
